What problems do we see in the field of behavioral health today?

- There is a growing gap in the need for behavioral health service providers.
- This is seen across settings, but it is especially relevant in the military behavioral health setting.
- Peer support can be included to support those in the mental health care profession.



- The literature is not precise.
- "A system of giving and receiving help founded on key principles of respect, shared responsibility, and an agreement of what is helpful."
- A peer is defined as an equal, someone with whom one shares demographic or social similarities, whereas support refers to "the kind of deeply felt empathy, encouragement, and assistance that people with shared experiences can offer one another within a reciprocal relationship."
- Four aspects of peer support: mutuality, connection, worldwide, and moving toward rather than moving away.


